

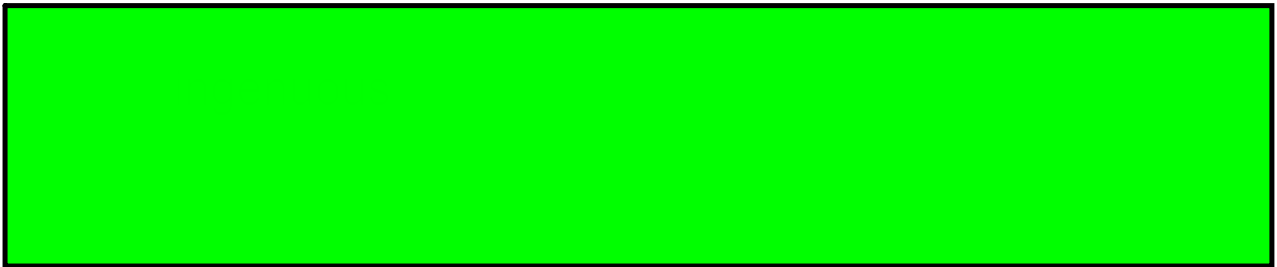

(verb-past tense)

Aspiration
(noun)
A hope or ambition of achieving something.

Eloquent
(adjective)
Fluent or persuasive in speaking or writing.

Articulate
(verb)
To express an idea or feeling fluently and coherently
