There are 4 kinds of sentences: declarative, interrogative, imperative, and exclamatory.

Declarative sentences make a statement and end with a period.

Interrogative sentences ask a question and end with a question mark.

Imperative sentences command or make a request and end with a period or an exclamation point. ("You" is often the implied subject of the command or request.)

Exclamatory sentences make either a statement or a command with strong feeling and end with an exclamation point.

> declarative: Marcie helps Anne finish her math assignment. interrogative: Does Mike know how to divide decimals?

imperative: Please ask him yourself.

exclamatory: I need an answer right now!
