There are 4 kinds of sentences: **declarative**, **interrogative**, **imperative**, and **exclamatory**.

- **Declarative** sentences make a statement and end with a period.
- **Interrogative** sentences ask a question and end with a question mark.
- **Imperative** sentences command or make a request and end with a period or an exclamation point. ("You" is often the implied subject of the command or request.)
- **Exclamatory** sentences make either a statement or a command with strong feeling and end with an exclamation point.

declarative: Marcie helps Anne finish her math assignment.

interrogative: Does Mike know how to divide decimals?

imperative: Please ask him yourself.

exclamatory: I need an answer right now!
